A DIRECTOR'S DIALOGUE & INSIGHT



The highlight of my year has been participating in the Diaspore Italiane conference that ran from December the 5 to the 7th in Genoa. The conference was co-hosted by Genoa and the Museums of Italian emigration and the Galata Museum as well as museums in Brazil and COASIT.

I gave a presentation titled "growing up Calabrese in Australia—contesting the negative stereotype of Calabrese in the media in Australia. The paper outlined, amongst other things, the projects undertaken by ACCA since its inception in order to contest that negative stereotype.

The conference was widely attended and there were about 90 presenters over the 3 days. I am pleased to say that the delegates were very interested in ACCA after my presentation, and I had some very stimulating discussions with delegates from the US and Canada as well as from Italy. Hopefully there will be publication of the papers in due course.



The conference confirmed my view that there is a great opportunity to connect with organisations in the other countries, because what emerged is that there were common issues confronted by immigrants in the various countries. Marco Fede was representing COASIT at the conference and he expressed an interest in discussing the contents of my paper. Hopefully that will take place in 2025.

Looking for a great read this Christmas?



Check out Pino Aprile's Il Nuovo Terroni (2024), which re-examines the impact of Italy's Unification on the South. Challenging the official narrative, Aprile argues that the North's invasion, aided by England and France, destroyed the Kingdom of Two Sicilies.

The book uncovers atrocities committed by the Northern army and exposes how history was manipulated to suppress the South's true story. With lessons for Australia, it also challenges the negative stereotypes of Calabrians and Southern Italians that still persist today.



A must-read for anyone interested in Italy's history and migration.

Who was the first Italian to win an academy award?

ANSWER: Tony Gaudio who won it for cinematography in the 1936 film "Anthony Adverse" directed by Mervyn Le Roy. Born Gaetano Antonio Gaudio in Celico, Cosenza, Italy in 1883 to a famous photographic family. His first film was "Napoleon Crossing the Alps" in 1903, and he eventually shot hundreds of short subjects for Italian film companies before moving to the US in 1906.



This is another lesser-known fact about the positive impact Calabrians have had in every country they've called home.
